- Present
 - Increase in working class and low-income households
 - Increase in abandoned homes
 - Increase in crime



The Neighborhood We Call Home Columbus' South Side


- 60% of households are rental (Franklin County 45%)
- 66% of area residents are a minority race (Franklin County 33%)
- 76% of households are single-parent homes (Franklin County 39%)
- 33% of households are at poverty rate (Franklin County 17%)
- 13% of adults with a bachelor's degree or higher (Franklin County 35%)

 - ✓ Workforce Development






The Affordable Vision

Healthy Neighborhoods, Healthy Families. Affordable Housing Impact

- 31 Residential Blocks –417 homes in HNHF Housing Zone
- 144 homes impacted in the area (Home Again, CD4AP, HNHF, and private investment)
- 116 HNHF homes improved (complete renovation/home repair grant program)
- 46 -Total number of HNHF homes sold
- 3 Healthy Homes on the market


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Before–Carpenter Street


