### Legal Need in Montana

1:12,133

One legal services attorney for every 12,133 Montanans living in poverty

1:274

One private attorney for every 274 Montanans over 125% of federal poverty line

- MLSA received over 6,300 requests for assistance in 2015.
- MLSA was forced to turn away 45% due to lack of resources.
- Advocates handled 3,114 cases, helping 7,868 people.
- Approximately 182,000 people living in poverty in 2015.
  - One in five Montanans is eligible for MLSA services.

# Developing Screening Questions & Procedures

- We utilized resources from NMLP.
- We worked with MPCA and CHC staff who are experts on data, informatics, and electronic medical records (eCW).
- Questions we asked:
  - What are CHCs already screening?
  - What is MLSA already screening?
  - At what point do we overwhelm the legal team?
  - What is happening with tracking social determinants of health that have some overlap with the MLP?
    - PRAPARE
  - Who do we screen?
  - How often do we screen?
  - How do we develop a uniform process for tracking the screening data?



### Advice for similar projects

- Have all partners at the table to make decisions, even when they are just listening.
- Ground your project in shared values. Come back to those values when you are struggling with decisions.
- Be ambitious.
- Be flexible.
