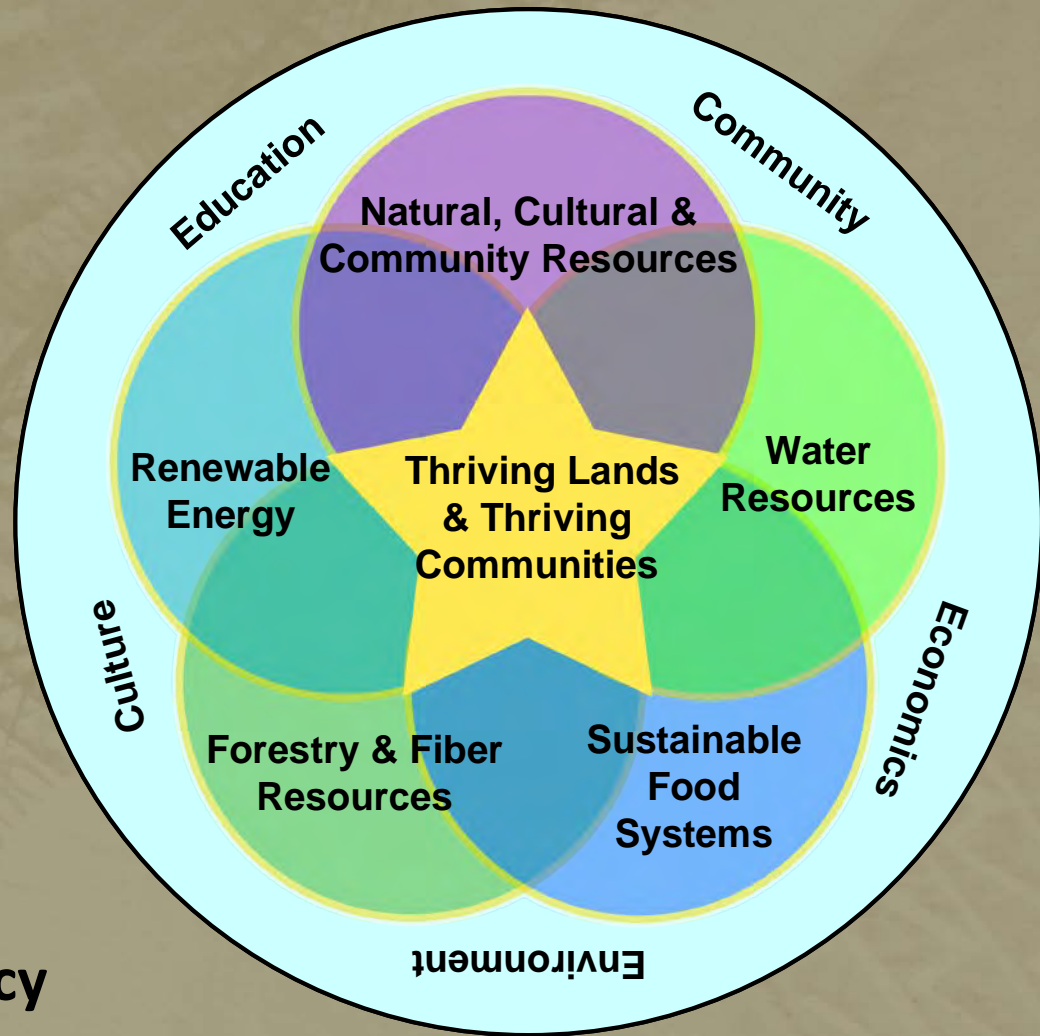

## KS Stewardship Policy

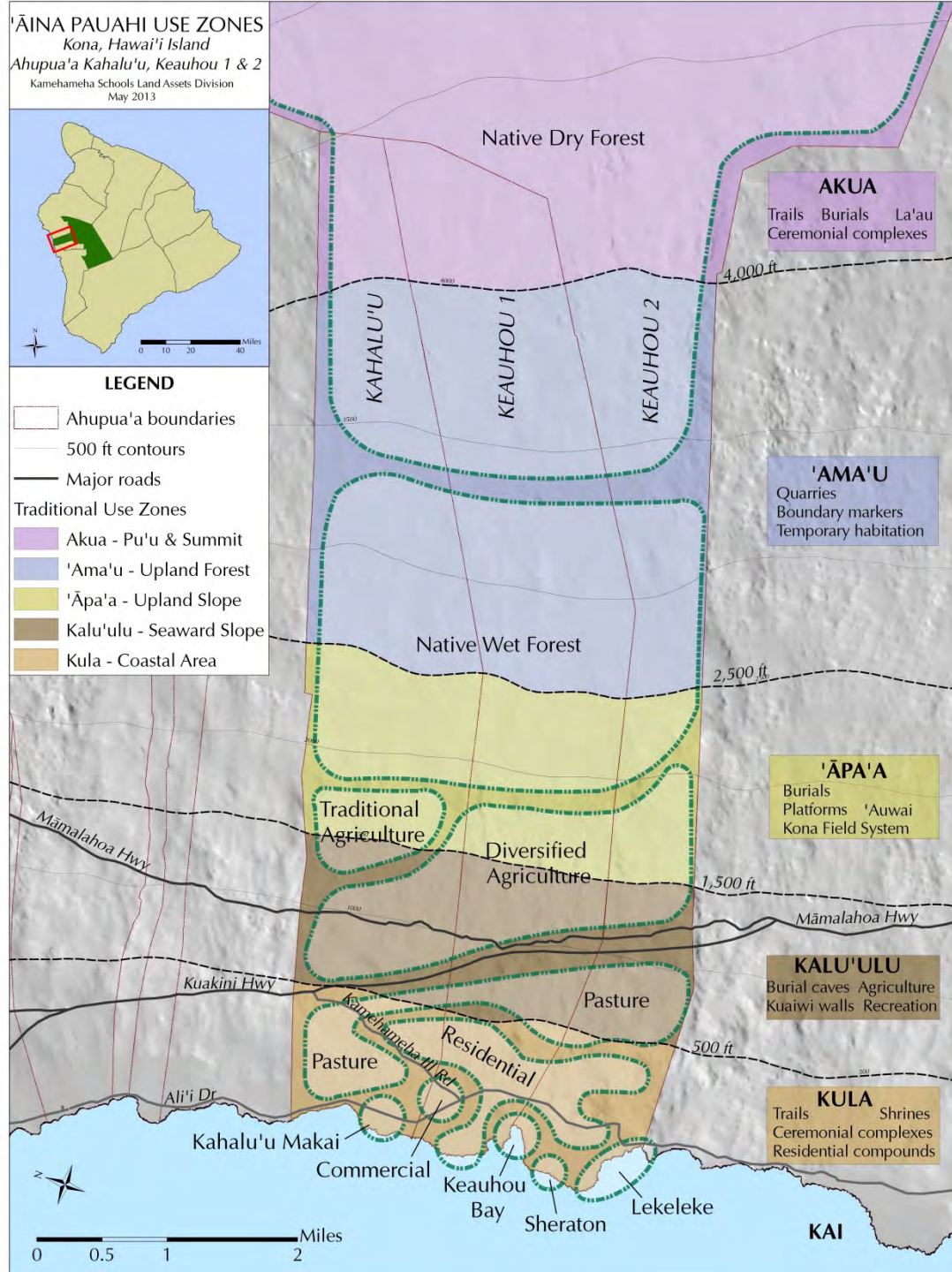
